Salford City Council is going to consultation. Put simply, due to a new law (The Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007) a review must be undertaken on the way the council is governed before the next local election in May 2010. This is a positive step for all Salford residents which will mean a good hard look at the best way to run things in the future.

There are two options available:

1. An elected mayor and cabinet or
2. A 'new-style' leader and cabinet executive

It is important to note that while neither option will give the council more power over the police or public transport, or give the council increased funding to spend on local services, they will both directly influence the methods of dealing with the local issues that affect you.

Salford City Council is inviting residents to have their say on the way the council governs the city and welcomes your vote and any additional comments on the options available.
