Making a big difference to young people with cancer

Impact living is an award winning UK based organisation which has specialised in supporting and housing vulnerable or disadvantaged young people throughout the last ten years, with its emphasis strongly focused on the empowerment and development of its clients.

Background to Young Heroes

Young Heroes is the latest project from Impact, which was inspired by Nissar Bahadur.

Nissar was one of Impact's first trainees. He proved to be a talented, thoughtful and hard working young man, who made a lasting impression on everybody he had close contact within both his professional and personal life.

In November 2004 after many months of pain, anguish and uncertainty Nissar was diagnosed with life threatening liver cancer. However, despite this devastating news he conducted himself with astounding dignity and courage, fighting as hard as he possibly could to beat the illness.

Nissar, his family and friends needed a tremendous amount of support and advice during his illness to be delivered in a sensitive manner. Unfortunately, Nissar and his family found that the services provided to people in his situation were inadequate. It was because of this that Impact decided to support them through this difficult period, providing general support and advice.

Nissar had often expressed a dream to travel and especially to visit America. Impact therefore offered to pay for a two week holiday to Florida for him, his sister and six of his closest friends. This holiday proved to be the most memorable experience of Nissar's young life, as stated on so many occasions by Nissar himself. Nissar had also stated a strong desire for Impact to help other young people who are in a similar situation as him and as a result of this Impact established Young Heroes.

Sadly, Nissar lost his battle with cancer only a few months after diagnosis and passed away on 18th February 2005, aged just 19 years old.





Making a big difference to young people with cancer

Each year in the UK over 2200 teenagers will find out that they have cancer. Often these young people are not diagnosed early enough, as symptoms can be dismissed as growing pains or minor ailments. This puts them at a greater risk than most other age groups as they are usually experiencing 'growth spurts' which can cause their cancers to grow more rapidly.

Cancer in teenagers is more common than you may think. By the age of 15 you have a 1 in 600 chance of developing cancer and the number of teenagers with cancer now exceeds the number of children with cancer.

Aims & Objectives

After an intensive investigation into the feasibility of a project like Young Heroes, Impact discovered that there was indeed a significant gap in service provision, especially for young people aged 13 to 25.

This is true for both young people who are personally suffering from cancer and for those who are caring for a parent, guardian or sibling with a life-threatening disease or condition.

With this in mind, Young Heroes proposes to:

- Improve the quality of life for people diagnosed with cancer and their families.
- To provide access to a trained personal support worker providing support and advice to an individual and their family or friends.
- A number of young people will be given the opportunity to take a short break or a holiday (either in England or at one of our properties abroad). This will give them a welcome break at a very stressful time, with up to five of their friends or family.
- To arrange one to one counselling.
- To arrange any feasible activity they may request.

Impact has recently launched a major fundraising appeal to assist with the initial development costs of Young Heroes with the creation of a 'Big Gift' account. Young Heroes has now become fully operational, with all its service provisions in place and aims to provide services to hundreds of young people over the coming years.
