### a) ROSCOE ROAD, IRLAM

The signalised junction at Liverpool Road/Fairhills Road has recently been upgraded. As part of the scheme bollards have been introduced on the west side of Liverpool Road at the junction of Roscoe Road, Irlam.

The owner of 506 Liverpool Road, which is a newsagent, has complained that since the introduction of the bollards he can no longer gain access to the private forecourt outside his premises where he used to park and load/unload. The owner gained access via a pedestrian dropped crossing located on Roscoe Road.

Roscoe Road is one way from Liverpool Road to Annable Road and has no waiting at any time restrictions on both sides. The one-way system was introduced in 1972 and the restrictions in 1976. It is considered the restrictions can be removed from the south west side to allow parking for the shop owner and customers without compromising highway safety. The shop owner has consulted 5 Roscoe Road who has no objections and number 7 is vacant and up for sale.

It is proposed to revoke the current restrictions on the southwest side from a point 15 metres of its junction with Liverpool Road to allow parking whilst keeping the junction protected. Emergency Services support the recommendation.







### c) THORN ROAD/FOLLY LANE, SWINTON

A complaint has been received from Swinton Open Space Community Association regarding vehicles being parked at the junction of Thorn Road/Folly Lane.

It is claimed vehicles park right up to the junction causing visibility problems when exiting Thorn Road. It is therefore proposed to introduce 10 metres of junction protection marking. Emergency Services support the recommendation.
