### a) New Cross Street, Swinton

A complaint has been received regarding vehicles parking on both sides of New Cross Street Swinton, in the vicinity of the Lakes Medical centre. This has the effect of narrowing the road to a single vehicle width, which causes congestion; with stationary vehicles at times queuing onto Chorley Road and interfering with traffic flow on Chorley Road. Any access into New Cross Street for emergency vehicles may be compromised by the current situation. In addition to this the excessive numbers of parked vehicles are seriously reducing visibility for traffic exiting the medical centre.

It is therefore proposed to continue the existing No waiting at any time restrictions and loading restrictions along the South side of New Cross Street to assist access and egress from the medical centre and prevent queuing traffic occurring on Chorley Road. Emergency services have no objections.







#### c) PHOEBE STREET, SALFORD

The Panel will recall approving the introduction of waiting restrictions on Phoebe Street, Salford as part of the first phase of the East West Link road. The restrictions were proposed to prevent vehicles parking on the approach to a new mini roundabout being constructed at the junction of Knowsley Avenue.

Since the construction of the new school on Phoebe Street, residents of 90 Phoebe St, 19 & 21 Napier Green whom all have driveways off Phoebe Street have experienced problems with parents blocking their driveways and ignoring the access protection marking. They have requested that the restrictions being proposed as part of the above scheme be increased to protect all their driveways. At the moment the proposed restrictions extend to cover the driveway of 19 & 21 Napier Green only.

It is therefore proposed to increase the restrictions as shown on the attached plan. Emergency Services have no objections.


