Thorpe Avenue / Cemetery Road South, Swinton.

A complaint has been received from residents of Thorpe Avenue and from the local authority Environmental services regarding the difficulties faced by refuse vehicles when attempting to access Thorpe Avenue, to carry out refuse collections. Due to parked vehicles, refuse vehicles are unable to turn into Thorpe Avenue from Cemetery Road South, resulting in the residents of Thorpe Avenue not having their dustbins emptied. A site visit has been carried out with Environmental services and the difficulties experienced by the refuse vehicles have been confirmed.

It is therefore proposed to introduce No waiting at any time to keep the junction clear in order to alleviate the problems experienced by refuse vehicles when accessing / exiting Thorpe Avenue. Emergency services have no objections.



INTRODUCTION OF NO WAITING AT ANY TIME.

Thorpe Avenue, both sides, from the western kerb line of Cemetery Road South, in a westerly direction for a distance of 10 metres.

Cemetery Road South, west side, from a point 5 metres south of the southern kerbline of Thorpe Avenue in a northerly direction to a point 5 metres north of the northern kerbline of Thorpe Avenue.

Hawthorn Drive / Ranelagh Road, Swinton.

A complaint has been received from Greater Manchester Police regarding difficulties experienced by residents of Hawthorn Drive and Ranelagh Road due to a large number of parked vehicles. These vehicles are parking close to junctions, in particular the junction of Hawthorn Drive and Ranelagh Road. This is seriously reducing visibility for road users at this junction. Following a site visit with Greater Manchester Police it is proposed to introduce No waiting at any time to keep the junction clear. Emergency services have no objections.

Hawthorn Drive, both sides, from the northern kerb line of Ranelagh Road, in a northerly direction for a distance of 10 metres.

Ranelagh Road, north side, from a point 10 metres west of the western kerbline of Hawthorn Drive in an easterly direction to a point 10 metres east of the eastern kerbline of Hawthorn Drive.
