c) ISLINGTON WAY, SALFORD

A complaint has been received from St Philip's C.E. Primary School regarding commuters into Manchester leaving their cars parked outside the school all day. It is claimed cars park on both sides of the street and this is causing access problems to the school for deliveries and the coach that takes the children to the local swimming baths can no longer pick them up from the school gates.

A request has also been received from Greater Manchester Police for the introduction of waiting restrictions to reduce the amount of vehicle crime in the area.

Site visits have confirmed that vehicles do park on both sides of Islington Way and also obstruct the approach to the traffic signals. It is proposed to introduce double yellow lines on both sides of Islington Way for its entire length and introduce a loading ban on the section between Chapel Street and Park Street. Emergency services have no objections.





d) LOWER SUTHERLAND STREET, SWINTON

A request has been received via a local ward councillor for the current restrictions on Lower Sutherland Street at the junction of Chorley Road to be extended and increased to 24 hr restrictions.

Working day restrictions were introduced on Lower Sutherland Street for a distance of 15 metres to prevent vehicles obstructing the junction after receiving complaints from members of the public.
