Rydal Crescent / Mereclough Avenue junction protection

A request has been received from local residents in relation to providing junction protection measures around the Rydal Crescent / Mereclough Avenue/ Kirkstone Avenue junction.

Following the construction of the new Walkden High School, a number of vehicles have been parking around the above junction, whilst pupils have been seen to cross in the area to access the school.

As such it is proposed to install double yellow lines to clear the junction improving visibility and safety around the junction.

3-year accident analysis

There have been no accidents reported in the last 36 months.

Proposal

Installation of double yellow line around the above junction.



As part of a new supermarket development on Pendleton Way a number of highway improvements are to be implemented including:

- 1) Introduction of three new controlled crossing points.
- 2) Footway and carriageway improvements.
- 3) Street lighting improvements
- 4) Introduction of a new taxi rank
- 5) Remarking of Bus Stands to include clearway markings.
- 6) Closing off of existing subway.

The purpose of the improvements is to provide safe access to and from the new site.

3-year accident analysis

There have been 2 minor injury accidents in the last 36 months.

Proposal

Implementation of a prohibition of waiting by vehicles with an exemption for taxis starting at a point 148m North East of the junction of Fitzwarren Street and Pendleton Way for 53 m.

- 1) Introduction of three new controlled crossing points.



FUNDING FROM MANAGEMENT COMPANY FOR MERCHANTS QUAY.

Merchants Quay, Salford.

A request has been received from the residents of Merchants Quay via the Management Company for additional waiting restrictions on Merchants Quay.

It is proposed to introduce additional No Waiting at any time restrictions along the whole of the northern side of Merchants Quay, and short stretches of restrictions, to protect entrances, along the southern side.

3-year collision analysis.

None recorded.

Estimated Cost:

Approximately £1500

Recommendation:

Introduction of No Waiting at any time:

Merchants Quay, Salford, North side, from a point 83.5 metres west of the western kerbline of Trafford Road, in a westerly direction, for a distance of 226 metres.

Merchants Quay Salford, North side, from a point 318 metres west of the western kerbline of Trafford Road, in a northerly direction, for a distance of 57 metres.

Merchants Quay Salford, South side, from a point 160 metres west of the western kerbline of Trafford Road, in a westerly direction, for a distance of 8 metres.

Merchants Quay, Salford, south side, from a point 195.5 metres west of the western kerbline of Trafford Road, in a westerly direction, for a distance of 16.5 metres.

Merchants Quay, Salford, south side, from a point 230.5 metres west of the western kerbline of Trafford Road, in a westerly direction, for a distance of 14.5 metres.

Merchants Quay, Salford, south side, from a point 283 metres west of the western kerbline of Trafford Road, in a westerly direction, for a distance of 12 metres.

Merchants Quay Salford, west side, from a point 411.5 metres west of the western kerbline of Trafford Road, in a northerly direction, for a distance of 3 metres.
